The Guild always welcomes new, as well as long-time, Guild members to participate on a committee. Some of the vacancies take minimal time and are a great way to be introduced to volunteering with the Guild and a way to get to know members.

# A High Priority for the Guild: Making Quilts to Comfort Others. This Year, Resolve to Get Involved.

Since the Guild's inception in 2006, we've been committed to pooling our collective talents to make beautiful quilts to comfort others in their time of need.

In 2018, we donated a total of 132 quilts! Of those, 104 were given to the Longmont Police Department and Fire Department who then donated to children and adults during a time of crisis or need in their life. During the traumatic times, the quilts provide comfort and let recipients know someone cares. Twenty-eight quilts were Pink Quilts donated to breast cancer survivors, to the Women's Shelter, and to the Cancer Treatment Center. All those quilts made people feel loved and cared about. **THANK YOU** for helping to stitch our lovely Community Outreach quilts to help people feel better. If you pieced any, quilted any or put binding on any, you made wonderful efforts to help children and adults feel cared about.

Community Outreach has always been one of the Guild's highest priorities. In 2019, we plan to donate some twin-size quilts to the Women's Shelter. The quilts should be close to 67" X 89". If you decide to make a top for this, please let us know—we will be very pleased to have you join in this effort!. We will have some kits that can be pieced that you can use, or you can make a top using your own fabric and pattern.

Options...Options...Options! We hope that almost

every Guild member can make one or more quilts this year for Community Outreach. We have several ways you can help. Of course, you may make one or more basic Community Outreach quilts from our kits. Kits are available at every monthly meeting and at all the Sew Days. They're

pre-cut—all you have to do is follow the instructions and sew. Or, you can make a quilt using your own fabric and pattern. The size we prefer is close to 40" X 60". We can provide you with backing, batting and binding, or you can provide your own. You may give us back just a pieced top, or you can quilt it and bind it also. Come chat with us and we'll see what we can work together to make.

We have a few longarmers who help to quilt our quilts and some members help to put on binding. We are so fortunate to have so many members help us!

To further our Outreach efforts, we will be making the blocks for the Pink Quilts at the January Sew Day, then having some members add the sashing and finish the top. Some longarmers will quilt them and some members will sew on the binding. The nomination forms for breast cancer survivors are on the website or can be picked up at all monthly meetings from the Outreach Table.

Hopefully in 2019 we will donate as many or even more quilts as last year. For more information, reach out to...

# 33<sup>rd</sup> Annual Quilt Show and Sale

## Interfaith Quilters of Longmont

Interfaith Quilters of Longmont will celebrate the 33<sup>rd</sup> Annual Quilt Show and Sale on March 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> of 2019. It will be held at the First Lutheran Church, 803 Third Avenue in Longmont, Colorado.

This event is always held on the first weekend in March. The preview will be open Friday evening, March 1<sup>st</sup> from 5pm till 8pm. (no sales) The sale will be held Saturday, March 2<sup>nd</sup> from 10am till 4pm.

The proceeds from these hand and machine made quilts will benefit the O.U.R. Center (Outreach United Resource Center) and the Safe Shelter of the Saint Vrain Valley. The entry donation of \$5 on Fridays preview also includes Saturday admission. On Saturday, the day of the sale, we ask for a \$1 entry donation. If you would like to purchase quilts on Saturday, methods of payment include cash, check and credit cards.

There will be about 600 quilts to choose from. You will find a wide variety of baby quilts, teen themed quilts, wall hangings, table toppers, placemats, lap quilts and pillows. There is a wide variety of sizes and colors of bed quilts. Fabric and books for quilting will also be sold. Everything we sell is reasonably priced and of great quality. Come view the quilts on Friday evening and buy the ones that captivate you on Saturday. The customer service volunteers wearing turquoise aprons will assist you in finding gifts for birthdays, babies, holidays, yourself, etc. and bring them to the check out counter for you. Support your local O.U.R. Center and Safe Shelter.

Quilt Appraisal is offered by Jeananne Wright. She is a Longmont resident who is very experienced in this process. If you have a quilt that you would like to have appraised at the show, call for an appointment. **303-772-7684**

## And the Winner is...






