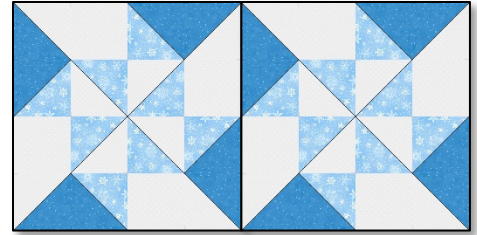


# Longmont Quilt Guild 2020 Block-of-the-Month

## November Block | Peaceful Winter

(12-1/2-inch block)



### Fabrics

#### A | White

Four 4-inch squares (*Mark one diagonal line, corner to corner on wrong side of each 4-inch square*)  
 Four 3-1/2-inch squares

#### B | Dark Blue

Four 4-inch squares

#### C | Medium/Light Blue

Four 4-inch squares (*Mark one diagonal line, corner to corner on wrong side of only TWO 4-inch squares*)

**Please read the instructions completely before beginning.** Pressing the seams as shown here (and as illustrated below with arrows) will make all the difference in having your points line up beautifully when this is pieced.

### Make Half-Square Triangle (HST) Units (Yields 12 Total)

White/Dark Blue HSTs (Yields 4): Pair two 4-inch White squares with a two 4-inch Dark Blue squares. With right sides together, sew a scant 1/4-inch along either side of the marked line on the back of the White fabric. Cut on the marked line and press the seam allowance to the Dark Blue fabric. Carefully square these up to 3-1/2 inches with the diagonal line on the ruler along the seam.



White/Medium-Light Blue HSTs (Yields 4): Pair two 4-inch White squares with a two 4-inch Medium/Light Blue squares. With right sides together, sew a scant 1/4-inch along either side of the marked line on the back of the White fabric. Cut on the marked line and press the seam allowance to the Medium/Light Blue fabric. Carefully square these up to 3-1/2 inches with the diagonal line on the ruler along the seam.



Dark/Medium-Light Blue HSTs (Yields 4): Pair two 4-inch Medium/Light Blue squares with a two 4-inch Dark Blue squares. With right sides together, sew a scant 1/4-inch along either side of the marked line on the back of the White fabric. Cut on the marked line and press the seam allowance to the Medium/Light Blue fabric. Carefully square these up to 3-1/2 inches with the diagonal line on the ruler along the seam.



### Assemble Block

Lay out all the units as shown, and sew together by rows, then sew the rows together to complete. As you piece, you can nest the diagonal seams if you have pressed them as shown here which will produce better points.
