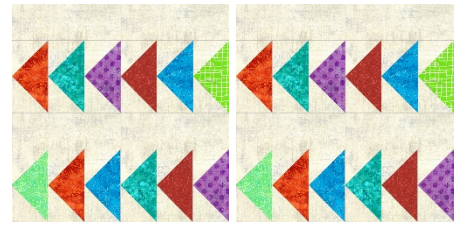

2022 Block-of-the-Month

February | Row of Geese



Fabrics (for each BOM)

Background | Beige/Off-White Fabric

Two 2-1/2-inch x 12-1/2-inch rectangles
Twenty-Four 2-1/2-inch squares

Various Medium to Dark Prints

Twelve 2-1/2-inch x 4-1/2-inch rectangles

<p><u>For BOM Lottery:</u></p> <p>Make 1 or more for 1 or more chances to win the blocks</p>	<p><u>For Your Sampler Quilt:</u></p> <p>The block shown here represents two units for your sampler quilt. You will make 4 units total, equivalent of 2 blocks. <i>Please note in directions below where it says to stop sewing units together for the Sampler.</i></p>
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Make Flying Geese

Makes 12 flying geese, each 2-1/2 x 4-1/2 inches

On the WRONG side of 24 of the Background 2-1/2-inch squares, mark a line ONCE on the diagonal.

Take one Medium to Dark Print 2-1/2 x 4-1/2- inch rectangle and place, right sides together, Background 2-1/2-inch square on top, matching edges at one end of rectangle. Sew ON the diagonal line. Trim 1/4 inch from the seam toward the corner. Take another 2-1/2-inch Background square and repeat this on the other side of the rectangle.

Repeat this for the remaining eleven Medium to Dark Print rectangles and 22 Background squares to yield 12 flying geese units.



Assemble Block

Lay out six flying geese and one Background 2-1/2 x 12-1/2-inch rectangles as shown below. Sew together. Repeat this for the other six flying geese and Background 2-1/2 x 12-1/2-inch rectangle. (*Note: Stop here for these blocks for your Sampler.*)



Lay out the two units you have just completed as shown and sew together to complete your block for the BOM block lottery.
